We will walk to Prince Rupert, BC to publicly address the key issues faced by marginalized, missing and murdered women, children and their families. We will be demanding a public inquiry for the more than three thousand unsolved cases of missing and murdered women & children in the last 10 years. Sadly, 80% are Aboriginal. We are looking for ongoing support for the families of these missing and murdered women. We need action from the investigative, judicial and government bodies of this province to end this violence against our women. With unyielding support from the Union of BC Indian Chiefs, First Nations Summit, Assembly of First Nations, Canadian Union of Postal Workers, Public Service Alliance Canada, Amnesty International, BC Government Employees Union, United Native Nations, Native Women's Association of Canada, Longshoreman's Union Local 500, BCGEU, BC Federation of Labor Most importantly, the support
